Yachts may register to enter for Racing Awards only or as a Fundraising Boat. Yachts wishing to compete for fund raising and sailing honors must declare themselves as a "fundraising" yacht on the attached form. ### 1. Powerboats for Junior Week

Junior Week is one of our club's most successful sailing programs, and it's all because of our Volunteers! We have a record number of young sailors and parents helping this year... we could use some powerboats to get all of the instructors out on the water with all those young sailors.

If you have a powerboat (large or small) that you would allow one of our certified instructors to operate, we could use your help. Junior Week is June 19-23. Paul Howle is coordinating this operation this year, please call him at home 285-3870. Thanks

### 2. Junior Week Check-in

If you have registered your child in Junior Week, you will be receiving a packet with the following information/forms: a Medical Information Sheet, a Release Form, a letter indicating class assignment and parent volunteer assignment, the Social Activities Schedule, and the Leukemia Society Small Boat Sail-a-thon form.

Please bring all of the forms (signed) to Check-in at the Club. OptiKids check-in is June 10th 8-

9AM for the morning class and 12-1PM for the afternoon class. Junior Week check-in is June 18th from 4-5:30PM or June 19th from 8-9AM.

### 3. Class Schedule

OptiKids classes will run from 9 a.m. to noon for the Morning Class; 1 to 4 p.m. for the Afternoon Class (your letter will tell you which class you and your child are in).

Junior Week activities will run from 9 a.m. to noon and 1p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 9 a.m. to noon on Friday. The Leukemia Society Small Boat Sail-a-thon will be held Friday afternoon. (See details on the facing page and in your Junior Week Information packet)

Finally, Check your boat NOW to make sure you have all the parts and pieces. LABEL EVERYTHING with your name or your sail number and make sure your skipper knows which is their number. Bailers can be made from liquid laundry soap bottles. The sources below can help identify and provide replacement parts. Sail ties are important!

## Keep your Opti Legal

Sail numbers didn't always come with Optimists. The boats have manufacturers serial numbers, And IYRU (now ISAF) numbers but sail numbers are assigned by registering with the United States Optimist Dinghy Association (USODA). Some of our fleet boats do not have numbers on the sails. Since the early 90's the boats have come preregistered with sail numbers assigned. Anytime an Optimist is sold or traded, the sail number registration or certificate should be re-registered with USODA. This keeps the boat legal (eligible for big regattas) and helps maintain its value. If buying a boat, ask for the certificate and mail it in to USODA at P.O. Box 150127, Altamonte Springs, FL 32715-0127.

It costs \$35.00 but also includes a one year USODA membership for the new skipper with a great bi-monthly newspaper, yearbook with their picture and opportunities to share their adventures. If you can't find the sail number, USODA can help search it from the IYRU or ISAF number.

### Sail-a-thon Sailing Instructions

#### 1. Rules

The "Sail-a-thon" will be governed by the racing rules of sailing (RRS), and by these sailing instructions.

#### 2. Entries

a) All eligible boats may be entered by completing the enclosed entry form.

b) Entry forms shall be in the hands of the Race Committee by the end of the Skippers' Meeting.

#### 3. Safety

A boat shall carry all equipment required by her class rules. If not so specified, she shall also carry one USCG-approved PFD for each person on board.

#### 4. Changes to Sailing Instructions

Any change to these sailing instructions will be announced at the Skippers' Meeting.

#### 5. Racing Area

The racing area(s) will be in the Fishing Bay area. A chart of the area will be provided at the Skippers' Meeting.

#### 6. The Course

The diagram printed is the course planned for the "Sail-a-thon" including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.



#### 7. The Start

The order of start and (or) the means to determine the order of start will be announced at the Skippers' Meeting.

#### 8. The Finish

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Committee boat and a finishing mark.

#### 9. Time Limit

The time limit will be **two (2) hours** for the event with all laps counted.

#### 10. Awards

Awards will be presented as follows:

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for the most money raised.

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for the most laps completed.

**Note:** This is a fundraising event. The pledge form attached to the brochure being mailed should be completed and turned in at the Skippers' Meeting on the day of the event.

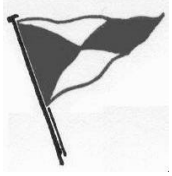

### **Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2000 – Arrival Parade of Sail**

At 7:00 A.M. on Friday, the Parade of Sail will officially begin. The tall ships will leave the anchorage area at Lynnhaven Roads and head West in the Thimble Shoals channel. The parade route includes: Thimble Shoal Channel, Norfolk Harbor Entrance Reach, Norfolk Harbor Reach, **Craney Island Reach (right where the Lafayette River joins the Elizabeth River, viewable from Anchorages N and O, easily accessible from NY&CC)**, Lambert Bend, Port Norfolk Reach and Town Point Reach. In the Chesapeake Bay, boaters will be allowed to move alongside the parade, outside of the secured channel. Because of the large number of spectator watercraft anticipated, waterborne traffic will essentially come to a halt from the Hampton Roads Bridge tunnel to beyond downtown Norfolk and Portsmouth on the Elizabeth River. The Coast Guard will restrict the waterway from 8:00 A.M. until approximately 5:00 P.M. There will be designated anchorages set up on the Elizabeth River along the parade route. **Boaters will be allowed to enter these anchorages Thursday, June 15<sup>th</sup> or very early on Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup>.** These anchorages will be secured during the day on Friday so that no boaters will be allowed to enter or leave while the Parade of Sail is in progress. The tall ships will be berthing in Downtown Norfolk, Portsmouth, Hampton and in Chesapeake near Great Bridge.

The Coast Guard will establish safety zones to close the parade route and restrict spectator and commercial vessels from designated areas for the duration of the Parade of Sail. In addition to closing the parade route at 0800, the Coast Guard will establish Vessel Traffic Control Points along the route to control the flow of spectator vessel traffic immediately prior to and during the parade. The ELIZABETH RIVER from the NAVAL SHIPYARD to the HAMPTON ROADS BRIDGE will be CLOSED until approximately 5:00 P.M.

## Laser News

An e-mail posting by Ted Morgan of Severn Sailing Association was posted on the club bulletin boards. It describes the exciting ride Laser sailors had at Wrightsville Beach for the Atlantic Coast Championships on May 13 hosted by Carolina YC. It includes some graphic descriptions of downwind and reaching in 20-25 knots and five foot waves. Coupled with some great sailing conditions during our first Frostbite series this means that Laser sailors have had much better sailing in 2000 than most other fleets. For the first Wednesday night sailing event, on May 10, we had more than 20 knots from the south which made getting off the beach a challenge. On May 24 we had a record seven Lasers out including Mark Cycotte as a first timer, and two ladies, one a regular and one we are working on.

Back to the Carolina YC on May 13, there were 58 full rigs and 23 radials. What was most noticeable about the younger set were some very light weights. One of the featherweights, who understandably came in early as the wind and waves increased for the second and third races, responded to my "do you weigh 100 lbs yet" question with a "yes Sir, 101!". And I saw more old hulls and five digit sail numbers that day than I have in a long time. Perhaps the lessons from these observations are that you don't have to be 130 lbs to sail a Laser Radial and that an older hull makes a good starter boat. The club owns a radial lower mast and radial sail so we can help you try out this growing class.
