website and check out the photos of how the property looks with many trees removed from the new property – it's incredible how much usable space was hiding in those woods. A slew of volunteers has begun transforming many parts of our property: the crew of Voodoo Chile pitched in to get a new fence built and fix a roof leak. House, Grounds, Docks, and Fleet have met monthly to organize repairs and improvements, and plans are unfolding to make the barn useful, get the docks in top shape, refurbish the hoist,...the list goes on.

On the sailing front, at last count there are six FBYC Flying Scot sailors packing for the mid-winters in Florida, and five laser sailors were on the water in December for the "Christmas Cup" regatta. Much time is devoted this time of year to re-writing the Sailing Events Book and the Year Book, lining up event chairs and their support teams for regattas and Junior Program, updating the website for the upcoming year, and preparing for winter activities such as Crew Training. Noel Clinard is leading an effort to host the 2007 Flying Scot North American Championships, a great honor if we are granted the privilege, and a precipitating event to define how our one-design facilities will ultimately be configured.

Update on Key Objectives

Last year, Commodore Jay Buhl provided quarterly updates in this newsletter on the key initiatives he established for FBYC. I'm not messing with a good thing, these initiatives are still underway with renewed vigor, so here's an update:

Club Management & Operations

Rear Commodore Ric Bauer and his team have devoted tremendous effort to define and prioritize specific club management and operations needs. For each area of our facilities (House, Grounds, Docks, Club Manager, & Fleet) they have developed specific needs requirements and detailed spending budgets, with actual expenditures tracked against plan. This level of organization has made it possible to solicit volunteers for specific tasks, or to seek competitive bids for professional work. Stable, capable, and reliable facilities will be the result, and the spending management program started last year by Vice Commodore Heyward continues unabated.

Long Range Planning

As promised, Strother Scott, with professional assistance from Deborah Usry, developed and conducted a comprehensive member survey during January. More than 275 of you completed the survey, and we thank you very much for the time and thought that you put into your responses. This survey is the foundation we will use for many years to develop and prioritize longrange plans for FBYC. There is no way for many of us on the "outside" to appreciate the magnitude of the survey development task, just as there is no understating the importance of its successful execution. Once the results have been developed and summarized, the Long-Range Planning Committee will resume its work with a September

Board Meeting Highlights

January 12, 2006

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Vice Commodore Allan Heyward.

<u>REAR COMMODORE –</u> <u>RICHARD A. BAUER, JR.</u>

<u>TREASURER</u> - Charitable contributions to various Deltaville organizations have now been made.

<u>HOUSE</u> – Wes advised that a licensed water system operator, Larry Dame, Utilities Director in Gloucester County, will be on duty for approximately six months. During that time, the club would like to have at least three people receive six months'

worth of experience working under Dame so that they can sit for the exam. Wes needs for one more person to volunteer. Ric Bauer explained to the Board that Ray Toms, who has been voluntarily taking care of the water system for 10 years, recently asked to be relieved of this responsibility. Ric advised that Ray has been an exemplary club volunteer and valued member for 42 years. He has served on the Board on many occasions and was elected a Life Member in 2003 in appreciation of his service to the club.

DOCKS – During the construction of the replacement bulkhead, which should begin in the near future, the power to the east and middle piers and to the water works may be temporarily shut off for less than 24 hours. The bulkhead contractor will also expand the finger piers at the end of the middle and east docks and replace some of the older pilings. The pump out facilities for Mr. Roberts will be reinstalled. Mayo Tabb reported that new electrical service to the outer eight slips on the middle pier and the outer 16 slips on the east dock will be provided, as well as 50amp service to the two slipholders who requested it. The six inner slips on the east dock will have the wiring replaced and new electrical service will also be run to the stable and relocated junior shack.

GROUNDS – Chip Hall met with the road contractor and agreed on the procedure to deal with water lines and drainage lines, including outfalls, when the road is relocated. The trees near the stable have been removed and topsoil that came out of the area will be spread over the septic area. Leroi Lissenden and two of his friends helped Dixon Cole and Chip install the Ralston boundary fence. Amy Esterbrook, a County official in the Planning Department, will inspect for wetlands and land disturbance completion once we seed the southern part of the new land. If approved, the County will release our Bond and we can begin the next phase, which includes moving the junior shack and boat storage racks, final improvements to the one-design storage area, and the pool reorientation.

MEMBER-AT-LARGE – Lud asked Jay Buhl to look into the capital expenditures that we are anticipating during 2006 and to track the year-to-date expenditures, the funds committed, funds forecast, and total exposure for each.

LONG RANGE PLANNINGStrother Scott reported that respons

Strother Scott reported that response to the survey has been good. When the survey is completed, the results will be analyzed and a report prepared. He expects the survey to cost under \$300.

<u>WEBMASTER</u> – Strother Scott advised that all events have been posted on the web site and he has added a Search Box that allows a member to obtain the names of everyone in a Zip Code.

WINTER PROGRAMS - John Rousmaniere will be the speaker at the February 10 winter program and the Bermuda High Party will be held on March 3. The Board also accepted a proposal by Dick Cole to hold a flea market at the club on March 18. Members only will be able to offer items for sale to other club members and their guests.

<u>HISTORIAN</u> – The library floor has been carpeted and Jere Dennison has the plaque for the door, courtesy of Acorn Sign.

<u>VICE COMMODORE – ALLAN</u> M. HEYWARD, JR.

OFFSHORE DIVISION — Alex Alvis has the offshore long distance race trophies and they will be awarded at the Bermuda High party. The new laptop is ready for use. Alex said that because so many of the perpetual trophies seem to duplicate each other, some changes might be appropriate where allowed.

<u>CRUISING DIVISION</u> – George Burke reported that the Italy Cruise has been canceled. Among the 16 cruising event Chairs for 2006, four are serving for the first time

<u>JUNIOR DIVISION</u> –Eric Powers ran an ad for a CIT in the December <u>Log</u>. Steve Wirt is getting Chairs (Continued on page 3)

<u>PROTEST</u> – Elizabeth Staas is talking with Dave Pyron about conducting a Protest Committee seminar at the club.

<u>CBYRA DELEGATE</u> – Tom Roberts reported that the J-24 events have been sanctioned and will be added to the CBYRA schedule. This will enable the J-24 racers to compete for the new CBYRA Region IV High Point during the upcoming season.

PARTICIPATION - David Hazlehurst and several others will hand out flyers about FBYC Crew Training at the weekend boat show in conjunction with the Norton Yacht Sales exhibit. David, Strother Scott, Mark Wensell and Jim Morrison (for Eric Powers) have been discussing a better system for organizing volunteers for club activities. They presented a proposal that would replace the current method of keeping up with which members have volunteered in each category. We would then have the capability to search for all members or volunteers interested in each category, track who is doing the jobs and who is not, make reports on who is due for a job and send e-mail reminders to the volunteers for each event.

NEW BUSINESS - Noel Clinard reported that FBYC has been invited by the Flying Scot Capitol District leadership and the Class Association to make a proposal by early March to be the Capitol District's host for the 2007 Flying Scot North American Championships. The Board has asked Noel to form a committee to study feasibility. The goal of the feasibility study is to determine if the club is capable of handling an event this size and, if so, to make a credible proposal. Noel will have a proposal ready for a decision at the February Board meeting.

FBYC History...

The Junior Seamanship Academy Jere Dennison

Early in our history, FBYC (then the Urbanna Yacht Club) demonstrated its commitment to training its youth in the art and science of sailing. During the early, dark days of World War II in 1942, the club established the Junior Seamanship Academy that met during five evenings at the St. James Parrish House in Richmond followed by on the water instruction on a 20-foot wooden sloop-rigged training vessel on Urbanna Creek and the Rappahannock River.

A postcard notice from our archives dated later in the decade read as follows

Come to the Urbanna Yacht Club's Junior Seamanship Academy

June 1 - Introduction to Course & Nomenclature

June 8 - Knots

June 15 – Ships Model


June 22 - Theory of Sailing

June 29 - Regulations of Right Away & Rules of the Road

AND NOW LADIES AND GENTLEMEN... THE 2006 FBYC SAILING SCHEDULE

By dint of hard work and perseverance, the Sailing Events Committee has finished putting together the 2006 Sailing Events Schedule, which is published elsewhere in this issue of the Log. We have labeled it "Preliminary" to remind you that although we don't anticipate any changes before the sailing books come out, you should be sure to check, because the unexpected does occur.

Over the last several years, we have been gaining in experience and expertise in race management. This year, we are increasing our efforts to build on this experience to keep improving the quality and consistency of our club racing programs and continue increasing the population of club members knowledgeable about all aspects of race management. For this reason, upcoming events that are not on the schedule, but which you will be hearing about and invited to participate in, are as important to our sailing events program as the races and cruises on the schedule.

The first of these is the Race Management seminars we will be holding for all those who volunteered as Race Chairs, and for everyone else with an interest in learning about race management. The first of these will have already been held by the time you read this, but more are coming. The seminars are supplemented by (and based on) the FBYC Race Management Handbook. Sharon Bauer has taken charge of revising and updating the Handbook this winter, and it will be standard issue to all of our volunteer race officers. In addition, Brooks Zerkel will be overseeing on-water training in the operation of Mr. Roberts and our mark boat(s) before and during the racing season, to raise the number of capable operators. Elizabeth Staas, our Protest Chair, is organizing a winter program on protest hearings and procedure by a well known and respected US Sailing Judge: even if you are never asked to serve, having a good understanding of the process will enhance your understanding of the rules and their application on the water. Finally, David Hazlehurst is leading the effort to reinvigorate our crew training program, designed to give rookies and non-racing sailors alike the confidence to get involved in our racing programs.

On the physical assets side, we are hard at work as well. A new (to us) mark boat is in the budget and on the horizon. A series of long-needed repairs to Mr. Roberts will make it a more hospitable place to work, and a workover of the race management hardware on Mr. Roberts should make race committee work run even more smoothly.

The Junior Division this year, under the guidance of Eric Powers, is undertaking an ambitious expansion of its offerings for Junior sailors and racers. Keep an eye out for full details in the Sailing Events Book and for a new section of the FBYC web site dedicated to the expanded Junior Program. One of the areas of expansion is **Team Racing**. Although long a staple of high school and collegiate sailing programs, team racing at Fishing Bay up until this year has only involved older one design sailors in the Flying Scot fleet. Not only are Juniors getting involved in this form of interclub competition, but its rising popularity has drawn the interest of fleets around the bay interested in doing team racing in J-24s and other classes, expanding the opportunities for FBYC sailors from all fleets to get involved. You'll be reading more about team racing opportunities and clinics for those interested in learning why and how "friends don't let friends finish last" in team racing, as the year goes on.

Against this backdrop, we have planned a sailing schedule that should give everyone plenty of sailing, but keeps our facilities available so we can respond to opportunities that arise over the course of the year. Among the relatively small number of changes to our traditional lineup of events in Offshore and One Design, the One Design spring and fall series are presented as a series of individual regattas to enhance opportunities to draw non-FBYC competitors, and the Offshore class will have informal Friday night racing in the form of "Beer Can Races". The Cruising fleet has its traditional full slate of cruising events on and off the Bay, providing little excuse for anyone to miss the pleasures of cruising on the Chesapeake at any time of the year. Through disciplined management of our schedule, we are pleased to be able to host an invitational regatta for the renascent J-24 class, and both Masters and District Championship racing for the Lasers. All in all, plenty to look forward to. (See pages 6 and 7 for Schedule) ©

Crew training.

For 16 years through 2004 the club MORC fleet ran a crew training program in Richmond which some skippers came to rely on as a source of crew for their off-shore boats. Last year we changed our approach to emphasize recruitment of club members but for the coming season we are again actively recruiting non-members to increase our pool of crew candidates. One more change, this year we are seeking crew for both off-shore and One Design boats.

To kick start this program we were offered a table alongside the Norton Boats display at the Richmond Boat Show with an 8 minute display of racing boats on a lap top prepared by our roving photographer, Jon Deutsch. Four club members manned the booth Friday the 13th through Sunday January 15, and we recruited 20 candidates for off-shore boats and 6, including 3 Juniors, for One Design. An interesting initial comment from one candidate was that while he'd sailed before he was not interested in getting yelled at. We assured him he would be safe if he sailed on any of the four boats represented at the show, and probably most of the others, but we couldn't make the same guarantee for all boats.

Where do we go from here? We plan a classroom session in Richmond in early March, with additional sessions if necessary, and we have on-the-water crew training scheduled for off shore boats on three days, April 8, 9 and 15. Needless to say, skippers who take candidates out on their boats will have the best chance of finding new crew members. To supplement our initial recruiting drive we are asking all members to start an ongoing effort to recruit their friends, neighbors and co-workers. In the five days since the Boat Show we have had recruiters active at the Federal Reserve Bank, in the Chesterfield County Schools, and a former crew trainee, and have added four more candidates to our list. For myself, I have had expressions of interest since New Years Day from a former member and from a new neighbor. Please help us find more candidates, particularly from our membership, including Juniors. You will find a link on the home page of the web site for candidates to sign up and learn more about this program. Please call or write me if you need any more information. We are very excited about the level of interest so far and have already had follow up inquiries from four of our Boat Show recruits.
