
Board Meeting Highlights April 13, 2006

Meeting called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Commodore Lud Kimbrough.

REAR COMMODORE - RICH-ARD A. BAUER, JR.

SECRETARY – Steve Gillispie announced that four delinquent members will be sent certified letters advising that if full payment is not received by April 30, their memberships will be suspended.

<u>TREASURER</u> – Paul Howle advised that capital expenditure is a significant item this year but the



majority of the work budgeted for has been completed.

<u>HOUSE</u> – The water system that supplies the facilities with fresh water has been re-worked and new devices installed. The goal is to improve the efficiency of the RO unit.

DOCKS – Mayo Tabb advised that the bulkhead and finger pier projects have been completed and 12 pilings replaced. Work on the pump out for *Mr. Roberts*, replacing the dinghy racks that were taken down for the bulkhead project and some limited electrical work remains to be done. There are eight boats on the slip waiting list. Mayo is obtaining information on some self-contained small air-conditioning units to be installed in the bathrooms in the main clubhouse.

SOCIAL – Mike Calkins reminded the Board that Jon Moody is Social Chair for Opening Day. The new format is a cocktail buffet from 6:00 – 9:00. Volunteers are needed for the upcoming Rosegill event.

GROUNDS – Almost 50 volunteers showed up on Clean Up Day and all tasks were completed. Strother Scott reported on the status of the new road. The contractor took down the trees earlier in the year and the road design is now available. After the designers stake out the roadway, the contractor would be able to bring his crew in about May 1 and should be finished with the road in a month. Allan Heyward stated that he would have no objection to that plan as long as the work did not interrupt or interfere with any club activities. The old road will not be taken up until the new road is ready for use.

LONG RANGE PLANNING – Strother Scott reported that the analysis team has completed the results summary pertaining to the Membership Survey. After a discussion concerning the best way to get the survey summaries to the members, it was decided they would be sent by mail. The Long Range Committee met March 23 and plans to complete its work by the deadline.

<u>WEBMASTER</u> – Strother Scott advised that all events listed in the Sailing Events Book are now listed on the web site for online registration.

<u>PUBLICITY</u> – Izumi Miller has distributed articles for the upcoming One-Design, Offshore and Junior races to various local papers and other news media.

<u>HISTORIAN</u> – Work on the Dan Austin Library is now complete and the shelving space is approximately 75% full.

<u>VICE COMMODORE – ALLAN</u> <u>M. HEYWARD, JR.</u>

FLEET CAPTAIN - Noel Clinard reported that FBYC has been chosen to host the Flying Scot North American Championships in June 2007. The event may attract as many as 120 boats. Because the club does not have the facilities to store all of the boats and cars or the ability to launch all of the boats using hoists and ramps as preferred by the boat owners, Noel has investigated whether we can use the facilities of other local businesses. Noel also discussed the possible acquisition of Automatic External Defibrillators ("AEDs"). He will arrange a presentation at the May Board meeting regarding AEDs before asking the Board to make a decision about the nurchase.

CRUISING DIVISION – The dinner buffet and planning session on April 1 was well attended. George discussed a proposal made John Koedel, III concerning an informal "short cruise" fleet. A white board would be available on which members could post information about short cruises they are going to make in the event other cruisers would like to join them. He would like to talk to the parents of junior members during Junior Week. John also suggested a link on the club's web site on which members could post information about short cruises. The Board accepted John's suggestions and Strother Scott advised that adding the link online would be easy to do.

<u>JUNIOR DIVISION</u> – Eric reported that the April 15 deadline for early

<u>PARTICIPATION</u> – David Hazlehurst advised that 23 candidates participated in the onthe-water crew training the first weekend. David is monitoring volunteerism and is keeping a list of those who complete their required duties.

OLD BUSINESS – Lud Kimbrough announced that in 2006, the Fishing Bay Challenge Bowl will be awarded to the team of Flying Scot sailors, chosen through competition, who represent FBYC in team racing against other yacht clubs. If there are multiple events, the team competing in the most highly competitive such event will be the winner. "Most highly competitive" will be determined based on the number of competing teams, prestige of the event and quality of competition based on their past performance in regional and national events.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u> – David Hazlehurst, Jere Dennison and Allan Heyward nominated Tim Blackwood for Life Membership in FBYC (see article in <u>Log</u>).

Lud Kimbrough reported that the Schooner *Virginia* has volunteered to attend and support the Leukemia Cup Regatta again this year. There is also a 7-day Youth Sailing Program that will begin July 9 aboard the *Virginia* and FBYC juniors will be encouraged to sign up.

As part of our emphasis on community outreach, Lud Kimbrough will speak to the Deltaville Community Association in May.

Lud reported that the offshore coaching program is off to a great start. Offshore racers have been asked to contribute their "check list" of things they do before going racing. Several members have sent information for this program.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m. ☺

Facilities Report

Ric Bauer, Rear Commodore

It's been said that "Success has a thousand fathers but failure is often an orphan." I want to thank all the volunteers and our subcontractors who were Fathers to this winters' many projects.

I am glad to report that all our major projects for capital asset improvements this year are **complete.** My few remaining finishing tasks, like the rebuilding of the dingy racks, will be done soon. My few remaining intended projects, like painting the barn roof and getting a new floor in place are "on stand by". Hopefully they will get done this year. Any able body that wants to help by contributing their time or their money are welcome. Just call me

My personal objective this year was to get as many of the needed improvements done as we could afford. Another personal goal to that end was to maximize the value of the end product for each members' dollar we spent. And I believe we did. The asset improvements made to the Clubs' facilities this winter were absolutely needed. They were adequately planned and budgeted. They were accomplished on time and within budget.

How did we get all this done and not only stay within budget but save thousands of dollars over the projected costs?

Valid question. I think my experience in commercial construction and a lot of hands on management probably helped. For example, with the bulkhead replacement project, I looked at the method for replacement and by working with an excellent contractor we were able to get 80% of the total bulkhead work completed at about 40% of the total project estimated cost(as projected 3 yrs.ago).

This saved us money this year and will again two years from now in 08 on the balance of the seawall work. Other examples are; the new pump-out system designed and built by Mayo Tabb. The dramatic improvements to our water facilities, engineered and installed by Wes Jones. The One Design parking area improvements as well as the Club House parking and

grounds improvements done during spring clean up which was orchestrated by Chip Hall. Of course, Dixon Cole was also involved in most every aspect of these projects. All the Clubs' member volunteers are making a difference and allowing us to stay within our budget while getting a lot of projects completed.

With this winters projects behind us, its time to go sailing. Those of us responsible for the land based part of the Clubs' activities will still be working to maintain reliable and stable services and facilities for the Club. Another part of that is to start looking ahead to next winter. We will now focus our efforts on the Fishing Bay ramps and docks. In order to build enthusiasm and increase participation with our One Design sailors we need to work with and listen to our small boat fleets. I intend to meet with the One Design Division Commander, Doug Margargee and the Fleet Captains to get ideas and ask for in put toward this initiative.

We can do all this and still have fun though, so lets go sailing. ©

Quarterly Update on Key Initiatives Club Management & Operations

Ric Bauer continues holding monthly meetings with the Club Manager and the chairs of Docks, Grounds, & House to prioritize projects and tightly manage spending. FBYC has gotten tremendous bang for every buck, in large part due to this initiative. Several planned capital projects have been put on hold at this time to provide a safety cushion to ensure we meet this year's debt-reduction targets. See Ric's full report elsewhere in this "Log".

Long Range Planning

Tremendous progress has been made in this key initiative. By now you should have received the Summary of the Survey. Each section of long range planning has incorporated input from the survey, and the Long Range Planning Committee has met twice in the past two months, with each subsection submitting their draft section plans for discussion and coordination with other sections. With the deserately needed bulkhead replacement and Jackson Creek

docks repairs this year our planned and actual capital investment has been substantial, so we implemented a detailed planning and tracking process to ensure maximum value from every penny as well as control over the big picture. Competitive bidding, handson project management, and leveraging the many skills of Club Manager Dixon as well as volunteers have maximized value to FBYC. The payoff has been great - for example, it now appears that our 5-year projected bulkhead replacements will cost \$40,000 less than our original long-


