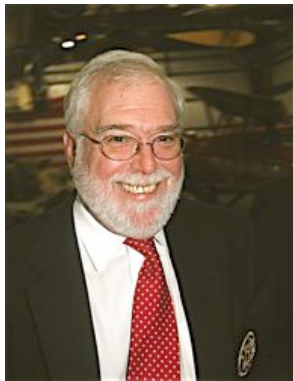

see the coaches and instructors – new and old – all energized and eager to go. Then I figured I'd wait until I got back from the Thursday Night dinner so I could report on how Junior Week was going. I'm glad I waited so I can report it was one of the prettiest evenings of the summer, and the overall relaxed mood was a reflection both of the weather and of how well the week went. How the kids responded to the week was evident from the fact that as long as there was light, kids were out sailing the Open Bic dinghies brought in by the manufacturer for demonstration. The pictures taken during Junior Week and posted on the web site tell the story of a successful week of learning and fun in nearly ideal conditions (though there doesn't seem to be a picture of the experiment with using a laboratory flask stopper as a substitute plug for a Mobjack: not recommended – at least using the kind of stopper with the hole for inserting piping). Kudos to Eric and Danelle Powers, Stephan and Alicia, Mike Toms, Diego, Dingo and Daniel, and all the coaches, instructors and volunteers, for a memorable week, capped by a successful Virginia State Junior Championship Regatta with 42 Lasers, Optis and 420s in attendance.

Speaking of Juniors, there were six Fishing Bay entries in the Junior Championship races sailed in the Flying Scot North Americans, with the Jacob family – Alex at the helm, Erin and James crewing – taking a third in tough competition. I waited until

after the Opening ceremonies of the Flying Scot North Americans to write my article so I could include that, and now I'm getting reports from the race course and am tempted to hold off even longer, but I promised the Log Streamer he'd have this by five, so I'd better wrap it up. I think the thing that most amazes me about the Flying Scot regatta is that in 1991, Buck Brewer, Phil Webb and Bill Bowie figured out we had enough Scots to charter a fleet. We all signed the paperwork and became Fleet 103. For several years thereafter, not much changed, then, slowly, the fleet began to grow. This weekend, 20 Fishing Bay Scots from Fleet 103 - including Sea Gull and mehitabel, two of the original boats in Fleet 103 - are racing, at home, in a class National Championship. Not only that, but Fishing Bay sailors will get another chance this summer to sail at home for a National Championship, when the Mobjack Nationals are held during the Annual One Design Regatta this August.

We had our annual Summer Board meeting at the clubhouse in June, followed by a reception for our new members and their sponsors. It was a great party and a great opportunity to extend the process of bringing new members into the FBYC family. One thing the event brought to mind is that of all the forms of service to the club, one of the most important, and probably the one that has the greatest long term impact on the club and its continued success, is sponsoring a membership application. Thank you, sponsors, keep up the great work.

Lolly and I are off to go sailing for a couple of weeks, so we'll miss the Sail for SIDS and the Leukemia Cup, but based on what I've seen of the preparations, I urge you not to miss them.

FBYC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

June 09, 2007

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Commodore Allan Heyward.

REAR COMMODORE – R. NOEL CLINARD

LOG – Jim Morrison ran a notice in the June issue of the Log stating that if a member prefers to read the color version of the Log that can be found on the web site rather than receiving the hard copy by mail, he would remove their name from the mailing list and send the Log to them by e-mail each month. Members who do not make a specific request for e-mail delivery will continue to receive the Log by regular mail. All members are encouraged to check out the version on the web site to see the quality of the color photographs.

HOUSE – Because of some issues with the water system in the past 45 days, Wes Jones reported that it is very important that all club members practice water conservation. This is particularly important during Junior Week, the Junior Regatta and the FS NAC's. Arrangements have been made to provide water for washing one-design boats that are on dollies and trailers.

DOCKS – The hoist is now repaired and working and it has been painted, all at a repair cost much less than originally thought.

GROUNDS – Mayo Tabb reported that the speed bumps have been painted, new

signs are up, electrical boxes have been painted and the pump-out station has new hoses. Virginia Power has fixed the transformer in the Flying Scot area and a barrier will be placed around it.

MEMBER-AT-LARGE – Lud Kimbrough reported that the upcoming Shallop Regatta would be an event enjoyed by racers and non-racers. Bob Kates is organizing the event and there will be coverage by National Geographic Magazine and Public TV. Bob has made arrangements with all property owners on Fishing Bay Road for spectators to watch the races from their waterfront property.

WEBMASTER – Strother Scott has now added the Volunteer Positions for all events that will take place for the remainder of the year. The automatic e-mail reminder plan is not yet functional. The web site went down on May 29 and it was necessary to shut down the site for part of a day while the system was restarted.

PUBLICITY – Valerie Hubbard reported that TV Channel 6, and possibly Channel 12, would be covering the FS NAC's. She has sent out releases about all events through September. The photographer for Virginia Living went out on the Race Committee boat on June 9 to take pictures to go with an upcoming article written by Valerie. **OPERATIONS MANAGER** – There are new seats in the Whaler. The barn has been pressure washed. Dixon Cole and Jere Dennison hoisted a Penguin sail from the upstairs ceiling in the clubhouse.

VICE COMMODORE – RICHARD A. BAUER, JR.

Ric advised that there is more sand on the new ramp than was on the old one. It appears that the ramp and adjacent dock wall are causing the accretion.

FLEET CAPTAIN – Jay Buhl has received e-mail confirmation from the Coast Guard that our 2007 Sailing Schedule has been approved.

OFFSHORE DIVISION – David Hinckle reported that scoring problems have been worked out and boats racing without valid ratings will not be scored. Mayo Tabb has posted a list of all of the valid PHRF ratings on Mr. Roberts.

ONE DESIGN DIVISION – Tom O'Connell reported that three One Design regattas were held for



the Spring Series races with the fourth abandoned because of heavy winds.

CRUISING DIVISION – George Burke reported that the Cruising Division has had good participation in their Spring events. An ongoing challenge is getting families and those with smaller boats involved. There are some shorter cruises coming up that will be good for those groups to participate in. The Jamestown Cruise is underway and runs from June 9 – 17.

JUNIOR DIVISION – Eric Powers reported that there are 89 registered for Junior Week, 23 for OptiKids, and 13 for Race Team. Learn2Sail is also getting good response. The coaches will arrive in Virginia on June 15, well in time for Junior Week. Six O'Pen BIC junior dinghies will be available at the club on June 22 for those participating in Junior Week to try out.

FLEET LT. – Mayo Tabb's PHRF database has been printed and put in a binder that can be found in Fannie's House.

PARTICIPATION – David Hazlehurst reported he has been disappointed with the response from the first group of members he asked to help with parking during the FS NAC's, primarily members who were not recorded as contributing any workdays during 2006. As expected, the response from regular contributors was much better. Delinquents will be offered

other opportunities to contribute their duty days as the season progresses.

NEW BUSINESS – Alex Alvis reported that the entrance into Jackson Creek is becoming a problem during low tide.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:20 p.m.

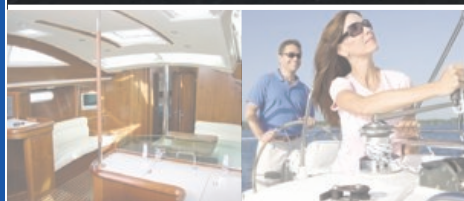

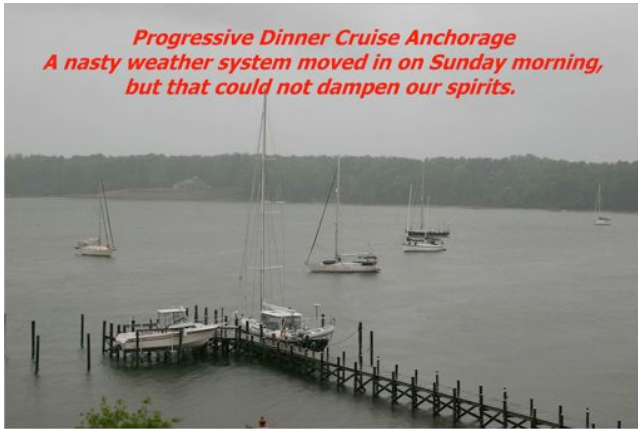
