75TH ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL MEMBERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES LIMITED TIME OFFERS

In celebration of Fishing Bay Yacht Club's 75th anniversary the Board of Trustees initiated a set of special membership opportunities, valid in 2014 only. We are taking these steps in fulfillment of our mission to promote and encourage sailing centered programs, activities and opportunities, and to recruit members less than 40 years of age. Reaching a younger demographic is our most challenging objective and the one most critical to our future.

The essence of this year-long membership recruitment campaign is a significant reduction in the initiation fee for a new or returning member. Our normal initiation fee is \$2,800; the following limited-time-offers make becoming a member in Fishing Bay Yacht Club in 2014 an opportunity one cannot afford to miss.

- Persons age 20 – 30, a \$300 initiation fee, with a "Forgiveness" credit for each year they remain in the Club, completed in 5 years.
- Persons age 31 – 40, a \$500 initiation fee, with a "Forgiveness" credit for each year they remain in the Club, completed in 5 years.
- Persons 41 and older – a \$1,000 initiation fee with pay off in one year.
- Crew member offer – upon sponsorship of the skipper, a crew member who has crewed for at least one year, may join with the initiation fee waived (pay no initiation fee).
- Boat partnership offer – boat partners, when both join at the same time, would pay only one (1) initiation fee, based on the age brackets described above (oldest partner).
- Re-applying former members offer – 25% of the initiation fee based on the age brackets described above with pay off in one year.

Friends don't let friends get blind-sided. If you have been reading this column for the past year you are aware that our need for new members is the underlying message of every article. Calling attention to the urgency of membership growth is not a case of “the sky is falling.” Chicken Little is not writing this column. No hyperbole or exaggeration is being used to get your attention. Hopefully, you trust these articles. In short, our Club is experiencing a true sea change, to use the nautical expression.

The past decade has witnessed a significant decline in membership and participation in sailing clubs all across the U.S. It's much larger than an FBYC problem. Young adults under the age of 40 are not getting involved in sailing or joining yachts clubs to the degree they did as recently as the 1990's. Most members are now over age 50 at many yacht clubs. The same can be said for FBYC.

If you read the three articles by Noel Clinard published in THE LOG this past fall, you got the unvarnished facts about the challenges facing us. Noel summarized the findings of the membership survey; he detailed the demographic trends of our membership; he called attention to the aging of our membership; and he put a spotlight on the proposals set forth in the Long Range Plan (LRP) calling for a change in our collective behavior as a sailing club. Eighty-plus Club members labored to develop the LRP, and all acknowledged that FBYC must make

a paradigm shift to grow our membership.

So, your doctor says you have to change your behavior or you are facing one or more chronic illnesses, waning health, and a declining quality of life. Let's not go there. Instead, let's collectively decide to adopt new behaviors. Let's come to terms with making a concerted effort to attract new members and to support the various initiatives now underway to attract younger adults. Doing nothing, but hoping things will improve, is not one of the habits of highly successful people.


The 2014 year special membership opportunities, with greatly reduced initiation fees, are a major effort to attract new members. Will it work? Too early to tell. Is it “fair” to existing members who paid the standard fee? Yes. Why? Unless we enlarge our membership, all of us will see annual increases in our dues and fees just to sustain our current programs. Also, new members equate with greater participation.

The skills, talents, and intelligence of our membership are our primary assets, and FBYC has these assets in abundance. Let's put them to good use for the Club and for you. And speaking of you, put on your FBYC hat, the one with our Club burgee on it. We need your thinking and engagement. It's just us now, unless we grow our membership.

Acknowledging over 7 years of success at Fishing Bay in hosting the Chesapeake Laser Master's Championship, Jon Deutsch's fellow sailors nominated him for this prestigious award. The President of BoatUS, Margaret Podlich, a big fan of Jon's work around the Bay and the Chesapeake Laser Master's Championship, spearheaded the nomination. After last Fall's regatta, Margaret asked for an endorsement of the nomination from the club, which the board heartily provided, as per then-Commodore George Burke's endorsement letter, paraphrased below. Another Bay Laser Sailor, Ted Morgan, also provided a timeline of the many contributions Jon has made to Laser sailing on the Bay and nationally.

Please join me and all of the other sailors at Fishing Bay, and beyond, in congratulating Jon on this well-deserved recognition for his outstanding contribution to the world of sailing.

Fishing Bay volunteers have been recognized on the national stage before: This award follows the One Design Sailing One-Design Regatta Award recognition that FBYC earned for the hosting Flying Scot North American Championships in 2007, led by Noel Clinard and Ric Bauer, and the Optimist Nationals in 2010, led by Noel Clinard and Jay Buhl.

"Jon Deutsch joined Fishing Bay Yacht Club with his family in the late 1990's and has been, from almost the first day, an incredible contributor to the the Yacht Club in general, the vitality of the Laser fleet in particular, and, through his volunteer work at the regional and national level with both Laser North America and US Sailing, with sailing as a whole.

In the beginning, Jon was a Laser sailor whose enthusiasm exceeded his effectiveness on the race course. Over the years,

he has made himself into an expert, both on the water and off. At the ripe old age of 32, Jon is in demand all over the Bay to run registration and scoring for events because of his ability to tackle daunting challenges with everyday aplomb. He has now run the Chesapeake Bay Laser Masters at FBYC for seven years. Thanks to Jon's efforts, the event never seems to disappoint, regardless of the weather. To attract 42 sailors last fall, in what we thought would be an "off" year, due to competing New England events, is a testament to the reputation he has built for the Master's regatta over the years.

In addition, Jon's documentation of events with his omnipresent GoPro and other cameras makes sailing more fun for all the participants. Every sailor looks forward to seeing the images uploaded to all the social media sites Jon connects with, as well as the Yacht Club site.

Jon epitomizes the vitality and competence that makes one-design sailing so fun for the participants – he brings energy, ability and focus to whatever he tackles and has the results to show for it."

JUNIOR DIVISION FUN!

The Junior Division has an action packed season planned from March through November, from beginners to day sailors to racers! All events have one thing in common: **FUN! FUN! FUN!**



2014 Junior Division Events:

Spring and Fall Opti Race Team: This team is designed especially for the junior sailor who plays other sports in the Spring and Fall, but who still wants to sail. The team will train and attend regattas on weekends under the supervision of a professional coach on a per diem basis. Parents pay only for the days their sailor can participate. March through May and September through November.

Private Sailing Lessons: The Junior Division will offer private lessons taught by the Opti Development Team coach in club owned Optis, Lasers, and 420s. The lessons are tailored to meet the needs of young sailors and adults, from beginners to advanced. May through August.



program is designed to introduce young children to sailing in a safe and fun environment, and to engender a love of the water and sailing. Parent participation is required. Ages 5 to 8. June 7-8, and June 14-15.

Junior Week: Fun for the whole family! Classes include Beginning Opti, Advanced Beginner, Intermediate Opti I through IV, Opti Racing, Advanced Opti Racing, Laser Racing, 420 Racing and Group Sailing in Keelboats. Classes are

taught by our professional coaches, US Sailing Instructors, and experienced volunteers. Nightly entertainment includes an ice cream social, pool party with hotdogs and a professional youth rock band, a Sail-A-Thon to raise money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, and a catered cook-out. Ages 6 to 18. June 16-20.

Opti Development Team: Race team devoted to teaching novice sailors and beginning racers the fundamentals of racing. The team is coached by college level sailors who are often graduates of our junior program, who will concentrate on building confidence and taking young sailors to the next level of sailing in a safe and fun environment. The team practices or attends regattas Thursdays through Sundays, and no session is mandatory. Ages 7 to 15. June 20 through August 10.

Opti and Laser Race Teams: Advanced race teams for experienced racers coached by world class professional race coaches. The team will practice or attend regattas six full days a week and travel across the Chesapeake Bay concentrating on CBYRA Corum Cup high point regattas. The team will also attend large national and regional events outside the Chesapeake Bay area. Significant travel is required. The coaches will concentrate on individualized instruction centered on advanced racing techniques in preparation for top level competition. Ages 10 to 18. June 7 through August 10.

Commonwealth of Virginia Junior Championship Regatta: Again this year we will host the Commonwealth the Saturday and Sunday following Junior Week. This is a high points regatta for the CBYRA Corum Cup. Last year 95 sailors attended from as far away as New York. We will offer a Green Fleet seminar and on-the-water coaching for novice racers (and their parents!) making that first scary step into regatta racing. June 21- 22.

Fun Sail: Afternoon of family fun on the club's boats! Activities will include fun races, a scavenger hunt and harbor cruise, followed by pizza at the pool. Open to all ages, including adults! July 26 (With the option to add more dates!)

Annual One-Design Regatta: August 9-10.

Laser Race Series: Juniors are invited by the FBYC Laser One-Design Fleet to participate in their Laser regattas through the year in Radial or Full Rig: May 4, Laser Clinic; May 5, Spring Regatta; July 27, Summer Regatta; September 14, Fall Regatta; November 9, Frostbite Regatta.

Head Coach and Laser Race Team Coach

We are excited to have Gabriel back for a third year at FBYC! He turned down other coaching opportunities on the Bay and in

South America so that he could return to oversee our coaches and coach the Laser Team.

Gabriel comes to us from Guayaquil, Ecuador, where he began racing at the age of 9. Gabriel's competitive sailing has taken him around the world, including across South America, the U.S. and Canada, Australia, Europe and ocean races through the Pacific Ocean. Just a few highlights of his spectacular racing career include winning the National Championships in Optis and Lasers in Ecuador, and numerous top 10 finishes in Opti, Laser and Sunfish at South American and World Championships. He has been featured in Sailing World Magazine, and was selected to appear in an ISAF sailing video sponsored by Rolex and aired on the BBC, Fox Sports, ESPN, Asian Network, and Eurosport channels.

Gabriel coaches during our winter months at Salinas Yacht Club in Ecuador, and has coached youth in the Opti, Sunfish, and Laser classes. Many of his students have won national and international competitions, both as individuals and in team racing in South America. Gabriel is a certified International Sailing Federation Level 3 Coach; and is completing his thesis in International Business.

Tomas is a professional coach from Rosario, Argentina. He began sailing at age 7, and made the Argentine Opti Team by age 10, representing Argentina at the 2002 Opti North Americans in Bermuda. From there he has had a phenomenal career racing in everything from Optis to offshore ocean racers. Just a few of his racing highlights include a 2nd in division at the 2002 Opti North Americans, 4th in his division in the 2003 Opti South Americans, 11th overall in the 2005 Opti South Americans, Argentine National Champion in team racing in 2005, and a 38th overall in the 2006 Opti Worlds! He was the 2009 South American champion in Laser 4.7 and Laser Radials, and the 2012 South American and Argentine Laser Radial champion. He has also successfully campaigned 420s and Lightnings. Tomas was one of the expert sailors appearing in the Optisailors DVD on Boat Handling, which is a cult classic among serious Opti sailors! (The club's library has had a copy for years.)

Tomas' coaching career has taken him throughout Argentina and South America. He has served as a coach for the New Zealand Opti National Team and as a coach for the LISOT team in Newport, Rhode Island.

Samuel comes to us from Ecuador, where he is also a professional coach at Salinas Yacht Club. He has taught and coached Optimist professionally since 2012, including many championship regattas.

His list of accomplishments are extensive, but highlights include being a former Ecuadorian national champion in Optis and Lightnings, and he has recorded many top finishes in South America in Lasers and Sunfish.

In addition to coaching professionally, Samuel has a bachelor's degree in business, and is currently studying Neuron-Linguistic programming at Federico Santa Maria University in Ecuador. Austin took Opti Kids that first summer and continued through the years to take all the courses offered during Junior Week. He volunteered for many years as a Counselor In Training during Junior Week, culminating in being the Lead Instructor for the Laser Racing Class in 2012, while still a junior. The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society kicks off its 2014 Southern Chesapeake Leukemia Cup Regatta season with a Richmond appearance by world-class sailor and ESPN commentator, Gary Jobson. A refreshment station will be provided by co-host Fishing Bay Yacht Club, the organizing authority for Regatta racing activities scheduled this year for the weekend of July 11-13 in Deltaville.


