#### **BOARD REPORT - November 2015**

#### SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS FROM NOVEMBER BOARD MEETING

November 12, 2015

#### **HOUSE CHAIR –**

- New Tables and Chairs: At the beginning of the season, we determined that it might be prudent, but not critical, to purchase six additional 6' tables that we would store upstairs at all times to avoid tearing up the trim when moving tables upstairs or downstairs. We should give some thought to the relative cost of purchasing the additional tables. We should consider the purchase of an additional 20-25 chairs that will stay with the 30 chairs that are already upstairs.
- **2. Bathroom Stalls**: The east bathhouse needs repair. Option A is to take out the old panels, sandblast them, paint and reinstall. Option B is to replace the existing panels with plastic partitions.
- **3. Freezer**: The existing freezer in the kitchen is on its last legs, but has gotten us through the season. The insulation on the lid is totally exposed and we should consider replacing the freezer before next season. A new freezer should cost less than \$1,000. (20 cu. ft. chest at Home Depot is \$675)
- **4. Motion Detectors**: The bathroom lights in Fannie's House and in Main Bathroom in Clubhouse stay on constantly if they aren't manually turned off. Particularly in the active season, this attracts bugs and causes additional costs in electricity use and bulb replacement. This is an item that should be handled when feasible. (Estimate \$250).
- **5. Garbage Cans**: More lidded 30 gal. garbage cans. Two to four for Main Clubhouse. (Estimate \$250)

**DOCKS CHAIR** – Water to the docks and pump out station has been turned off and will remain off until spring.

**SOCIAL CHAIR** – The Closing Day Oyster Roast was well-attended despite the weather.

#### **GROUNDS CHAIR** – General Summary:

- The last campus lawn mowing completed in early November
- Fall cleanup date is scheduled for Saturday, November 21st. To date, we have 15 member volunteers who have signed up or contacted me

**Pool**: The pool is closed for the season, with water lines purged and the cover installed.

**Electrical**: The Wi-Fi camera overlooking the Junior area has been installed.

**Barn**: The barn roof is buckling at the roof line in two places – either from water damage or wind. During the

last weather event, water leaked through the roof and saturated the One Design storage room floor on the west side of the building. In addition, the facility's roof and exterior walls need serious attention.

**Grounds**: Lighting has been installed for our new club sign. A landscape design is being considered.

**Miscellaneous**: Before EOY, our goals are to:

- Remove the old FBYC stand and sign from the location opposite Fannie's house, and seed and mulch the exposed ground
- Get Flag approval to donate the old sign to the Deltaville Maritime Museum's FBYC display
- Remove the old holly tree and existing stump/vines from the area near the dry sail lot/adjacent to road

**MEMBER AT LARGE** – There is one vacant Board position for 2016: **Adult Sailing Program Director**. Matt will serve in this position until a permanent director can be found.

**WEB MASTER** – The website will be undergoing some drastic internal changes to make it more modernized and user-friendly. Timing will be an important factor in this transition. The general user should experience no problems in using the website during this time.

**FLEET CAPTAIN** – Batteries have been inspected. Flags have been reconciled. Marks are accounted for and in good shape.

**ONE DESIGN DIV. CDR** – Eight boats participated in the final Laser Series – the scores will be compiled. Annual Flying Scot Award was contested this year; will review wording for future clarity.

**CRUISING DIV. CDR** – The Cruising Division Highlights: 16 events, five new cruise leaders, 80 boats and 200 members participated in total. The wine tours and Urbanna art tour were very popular this year. Cruiser participation in the Closing Day Oyster Roast was small; they may go back to hosting their own year-end dinner.

#### JUNIOR DIV. CDR – Mark Hayes:

**Fall Race Teams**: Since the October Board Report, the Fall Opti Race Team has sailed in three regattas, with excellent participation and results. Three of our sailors have accepted invitations to represent the United States in International competitions next year in the Netherlands and in Italy. Benton Amthor won the ACCs in October in Annapolis, with Guthrie Braun coming in 25th out of 201 boats. FBYC competed in and won an invitational regatta at the South Carolina Yacht Club. This regatta has gained excellent media attention, with articles in *Sail 1 Design*

and *Scuttlebutt*. An article will also appear in the national *OptiNews* magazine about this regatta and the ACCs. Unless our team decides to attend the 2015 Midwinters in New Orleans, this completes the fall race schedule.

**Planning for 2016**: Planning for 2016 continues to be a priority, with training and transitioning the new Junior Division officers and volunteers.

#### **Miscellaneous:**

- Fawcett Boat Supplies has informed us that they have received our order, consisting of two new RIB covers and one new tow bar. Member Paul Almany will pick the order up in Annapolis for us.
- The new Commander and Lieutenant Commander are finalizing the 2016 schedule along with the Board's Scheduling Committee; and finalizing the detailed Junior Operating Budget and 2016 pricing.

**CBYRA DELEGATE** – 2016 CBYRA dues have been paid, and Tom Roberts will be attending the CBYRA annual meeting. Members are encouraged to contact him with any input that they have.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

Commodore Matt Braun shared that the local marina owners have made a presentation to the Middlesex County Board of Supervisors regarding their stance/ position on the county boat tax. Matt has no follow-up on this meeting as of yet, but as details become available, he will share them.

Rear Commodore David Lennarz provided the Board with an update from the Middlesex Water Authority (MWA): As of October 14, 2015, 528 had committed to the program. This number is well-short of what was needed to go forward. The MWA is continuing to promote the program and they hope to come up with a revised, workable model. They have advised that they will have a "go or no-go" decision by mid-January.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Two items as reported by Commodore Braun:

- PHRF: Splits to be voted on mid-December.
- The Middlesex County Dredge Fund. A request is going to be initiated to the Fund for dredging between #7 and #9 (east/west orientation).

# JUNIORS FINISH STRONG & GETTING READY FOR 2016!

FBYC Juniors finished out the fall sailing season with some of their most impressive results of the year competing in four major regattas ranging from as far north as Newport, RI to as far south as to Hilton Head ,SC.

#### USODA South East Championship – Camp Sea Gull, NC

September 19th & 20th, our Fall Opti Race Team dominated at the 2015 USODA Southeast Championship! The regatta was held at Camp Sea Gull, on the Neuse River, in North Carolina. There were 86 boats on the water, and all of our kids had outstanding finishes, including 2nd, 4th, and 5th! That is three in the top five! Benton Amthor was 2nd overall, Nathan Smith was 4th overall, and Guthrie Braun was 5th overall. In addition, Reed McAllister was 1st in the White Fleet. We had a total of 10 kids who made the trip, and six scored in the top 23, qualifying them for the 2016 USODA Team Trials! Even our youngest and least experienced sailors did outstanding!

#### USODA Atlantic Coast Championship – Annapolis, MD

FBYC's own Benton Amthor WON the 2015 United States Optimist Dinghy Association Atlantic Coast Championship! The regatta was sailed October 24th & 25th at Annapolis Yacht Club. 201 boats competed in the Championship Fleet, not including the Green Fleet. The regatta was billed as the largest regatta ever hosted in Annapolis. After a highly competitive and hard fought battle through the last race, Benton edged out the current United States National Champion for first place. Benton won 1st Overall and 1st in the Red Fleet. Teammate Reed McAllister was 8th in the White Fleet.

#### **USODA Spring Team Qualifier – Newport, RI**

The United States Optimist Dinghy Association Spring Team Qualifier was sailed October 10th-12th, in Newport, Rhode Island. There were 245 of the best Opti sailors from across the United States racing; all hoping to earn a spot on one of the USODA spring teams.

Our kids sailed fantastic; although we did have one scare. We had four members make the trip: Benton Amthor, who finished 22nd; Boyd Bragg, who finished 23rd; Nathan Smith, who finished 71st; and Guthrie Braun. Guthrie had finished as high as 4th in one race, but had to withdraw from the regatta due to a mild concussion he sustained when hit by his boom in the windy conditions. Our coach, Bobby Lippincott, was quickly on the scene with the



FBYC RIB to assist; but Guthrie got to watch the remainder of the racing with the adults on shore. We know he will be back winning races soon

#### South Carolina Yacht Club Invitational - Hilton Head, SC.

The Fall Opti Race Team won the inaugural South Carolina Yacht Club Invitational Optimist Team Race Regatta! The regatta was sailed November 7th-8th, in Calibogue Sound, near the entrance to Windmill Harbor, at Hilton Head, South Carolina. Our team was made up of Benton Amthor, Nathan Smith, Guthrie Braun and Reed McAllister; and was coached by our Spring/Fall Opti Coach, Bob Lippincott.

FBYC received the invitation to sail in the regatta last spring, along with Opti teams from the Chicago Yacht Club, the Edgewater Yacht Club, the Florida Yacht Club, and the Royal Canadian Yacht Club of Ontario. The host

club, South Carolina Yacht Club, also competed. The regatta consisted of a round-robin and final series. Our team won all but one race throughout the entire regatta!

The Junior Division leadership team is gearing up for a great 2016. Mark your calendars now for some great Junior Activities! Registration opens February 1, 2016 for all activities and spaces will fill up fast!



**Opti Kids**: Half-days on June 11th, 12th and June 18th, 19th (two consecutive weekends). Perfect for our youngest beginning sailors, this program is taught in waist-deep water off our beach, and is designed to start our children sailing in a fun, carefree, and secure environment with hands on learning. No yelling and nothing but fun! A parent or guardian is required to assist in the class and get in the water. Ages 5 to 8 welcome.



**Junior Week**: June 20th through June 24th. Junior Week is our longest running event, and is still the centerpiece of our summer program. Sailors may choose from Beginner Opti, Advanced Beginner Opti, Intermediate Opti, Opti Racing, Advanced Opti Racing, Advanced Laser Racing, 420, Group sailing in keel boats, or assist as a Counselor in Training. **Private Lessons**: May through August. We will again offer private lessons for individuals or groups of up to five sailors. Lessons are tailored to meet the needs of the individual or group, from a five-year-old taking his or her first tentative steps in sailing off our beach, to a pre-teen looking to build the confidence to sail alone on Fishing Bay, to an 18-year-old honing his or her racing skills and even adult beginners, and everyone in-between! The lessons will be taught in the Club's Optis, Lasers or 420s by the Opti Development Team coaches.

**Fun Sail**: July 9th. Join us for an afternoon of family fun in the Club's Optis! Activities will include fun races, a scavenger hunt and harbor cruise, followed by pizza at the club! The activities will be geared for ages 6 to 12. Be ready to have fun and enjoy sailing and good friends in a supervised, stress-free environment

**Opti & Laser Development Teams**: June 24th through August 14th. Originally conceived as stepping stone to the Race Teams, our development teams have grown into a force of their own! The sailors meet for practices or regattas Thursdays through Sundays; and in consideration of working parents and tired sailors, no session or regatta is mandatory. For most of the summer the team attends regattas close to home in the Southern Bay, where overnight stays are not required

**Opti and Laser Race Teams**: June 14th through August 14th. Fishing Bay Yacht Club's Junior Race Teams have grown into regional and nationally renowned organizations, attracting the best international coaches. These teams have the opportunity to sail six days a week and travel across the United States to outstanding regattas creating a lifetime of memories for sailors and parents alike.

**FBYC Junior Regatta** – June 25th & June 26th. Join us the weekend immediately following Junior Week for FBYC Junior Regatta. This is a great opportunity for sailors who have just completed Junior Week to leverage their skills on the race course in a fun environment.

**Spring & Fall Racing Teams** – Once again we plan to have professional coaches available on a per diem basis for junior sailors that are interested in spring and fall racing. Practices will be scheduled based on coach and participant availability. Spring Racing will run March 3rd – May 29th and Fall Racing September 3rd – November 26th.

## FALL OPTI RACE TEAM SHINES BRIGHT AT SOUTHEAST CHAMPIONSHIP AND SPRING TEAM QUALIFIER!!

Until three years ago, Camp Sea Gull had never hosted a major junior regatta, when the Camp won the bid to host the 2012 Southeast Championship. That regatta was run so well, and was so successful, that this year's event drew kids from across the Southeast, including Maryland, Virginia, North and South Carolina, Georgia and Florida; and as far north as New York.

The racing was awesome! On Saturday the wind was steady from the northeast in the upper teens, with heavy chop on the Neuse River, with unlimited fetch. Sunday the winds laid down to under 10 knots. The USODA sends its own professional Principle Race Officer to its regattas, and local clubs and organizations provide the manpower. For this reason, sailors can depend on USODA events to be well run and safe. In addition to the racing, the shore facilities and organization was outstanding at Camp Sea Gull. Several of the families stayed in the cottages at the Camp, and ate on-site in the cafeteria; while others rented cottages nearby. The camp runs various programs through the fall, and utilized its professional staff to run the regatta. We had the run of the beautiful grounds, with a sandy beach for launching and a ramp for the coach RIBS. Our parents and the kids agreed that it was the best regatta they had ever attended!

Of the 10 kids we had racing at the Southeast Championship, six finished in the top guarter, which qualified them for the 2016 USODA Team Trials. The Team Trials is a single regatta held each year early in the spring to set the international teams representing the United States around the world that summer. A separate regatta, the Spring Qualifier, is held in the fall to set the teams for the early spring regattas. Only the top quarter of the finishers at the various USODA events are invited to the Team Trials, and based on their performance at Team Trials, are then invited to join the international teams. Benton, Nathan, and Guthrie had gualified at earlier regattas: and at the Southeast Championship. John Vail, Reed McAllister and William Cornell also gualified. Altogether, FBYC has gualified 10 members to race at the 2016 Team Trials! In 2015 we had five kids compete at Team Trials, and four received invitations to represent the United States in international regattas, with two accepting and competing overseas.

Over the next few weeks invitations will be extended by the USODA for the spring international regattas based on this past weekend's results, and our sailors will likely receive invitations based on their strong finishes. Then in the spring, 10 of our kids are invited to compete at the Team Trials-to be held in San Francisco! Look for updates in future Logs.
