SPRING INTO SAILING

Each year the Commodore selects a boat or class to compete for The Fishing Bay Challenge Trophy. This year it will be the Offshore Division's – PHRF Non-Spin class. I

encourage offshore boats that have not yet tried racing to come out and compete for this trophy. If any skippers are looking for crew, Jon Deutsch, our One Design Division commander, has another large group of crew trainees in production. A meeting event for skippers looking for crew will be on **Tuesday, April 12** at The Virginia Power Boat Association. Details are on our website.

A number of us may be looking for a way to get out on the water this year, but do not care to race or do not have a suitable boat. The solution is to get involved with Committee Boat volunteering. A classroom training session on Committee Boat service will be conducted by Jim Raper, Offshore Division lieutenant commander, on **Saturday, April 30**. This will be followed up with on the water Committee Boat sessions during One-Design races in May.

FBYC has a large fleet of Flying Scots and we always are looking for crew and new racing skippers. The leadership of this fleet is conducting an orientation for anyone interested in sailing a Flying Scot on **April 30**. This event is open to anyone interested in learning and being introduced to a Flying Scot. Participants will be given an overview of the boat on land and a chance to crew on one with an experienced skipper. This will be a low-key way to try a new boat.

BOARD REPORT - March 2016

FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB - BOARD MEETING

Selected highlights from the March board meeting.

HOUSE CHAIR – The porch door repair/staining project is complete. The back stairs will be stained next. The exterior of the East Bath House is still to be painted. Speakers are to be installed on the porch, coat hooks will be added near the restrooms of the Main Club House and the picnic tables will be replaced.

DOCKS CHAIR –The bearings have been replaced on the hoist; it has passed inspection and is ready for use. The water is on at the docks.

SOCIAL CHAIR -

- 1. Opening Day: Saturday, April 9. Schedule includes 5 p.m. cocktails at Ric's Place, 5:30 p.m. Blessing of the Fleet (Fishing Bay/Main Clubhouse), 6 p.m. dinner, 6:30 p.m. Alex Crane Band.
- **2. Open House (Memorial Day)**: Sunday, May 29. Schedule includes racing and raft up timeline similar to 2015. The Jackass Flats Band is confirmed.
- **3. July 4th**: Monday, July 4 cookout and long-distance race will be an economical event with family friendly cost structure.
- **4. Annual One Design**: 77th Annual One Design Regatta will be Saturday, August 13 and Sunday, August 14. There will be a dinner on Saturday evening. More details to come.
- **5. Stingray Point Regatta**: Friday, September 2 through Sunday, September 4. Schedule includes a casual Friday night pizza dinner, catered Saturday night dinner and Sunday hot dog cookout. Out of town participants will be able to enjoy the Club during the weekend. The Alex Crane Band is scheduled to play.
- **6. Commodore's Ball**: Currently in the planning stages.

GROUNDS CHAIR -

- 1. **Barn**: Work will begin on the barn roof toward the end of March
- **2. Grounds**: Earmarked March 19th for the spring cleanup. To date, 13 members signed up.
- **3. Pool and Pavilion**: Both the main and children's pool covers have been replaced and installed.
- 4. Miscellaneous:
 - The new fence abutting Jackson Creek has been installed.
 - The sign on Highway 33 was damaged during the snow storm by VDOT; the new sign is larger and will require two posts and will be installed before opening day.

- The planter with the old sign in front of Fannie's will be removed before opening day.
- **5. Future Projects**: New picnic tables behind the main clubhouse.

WINTER PROGRAMS –The "Blue Water Cruising" seminar with Rob and Andi Overton is on Wednesday, March 30th at the Omni Hotel.

MARKETING – FBYC Sign Project Update:

- In 2016 we will complete Phase III of the FBYC sign program board approved in 2014. Phase III consists of uniform signage on our buildings and docks.
- New, complete set of decals for Mr. Roberts need to be ordered and installed before Opening Day.

YAM CHAIR – YAM has an upcoming Happy Hour planned, details to follow. YAM asked to provide schedule of events to Board.

FLEET CAPTAIN – Letters from the Coast Guard confirming that (as in the past) no permits are needed for any of our events for the coming season were received. These constitute our Coast Guard "approvals." The next project is to ensure that we have a complete inventory of race flags for the start of the season.

OFFSHORE DIV CDR. – The J/70 Training program is progressing. The date for the J/70 Champion Invitational conflicts with the current schedule. Fleet 5 of the J/70 skippers has requested that the race be held in conjunction with the Stingray Regatta. Fleet 5 was honored with the request to host the 2017 East Coast Championship. FBYC or Hampton to be possible location for this fall event; John McCarthy to serve as PRO.

OFFSHORE DIV. LT. CDR. – Crew Training scheduled for April 30th has a few sign-ups; will market to increase numbers.

OFFSHORE DIV. RACE CHAIR -

- 1. All 2016 Offshore events have a PRO assigned except for Fall Series #4.
- 2. A written schedule was sent in February to those PROs who had already committed as a follow up.
- All the Offshore Spring Series PROs will be called within the next two weeks as a confirmation of his/ her commitment.
- 4. Brooks Zerkel who is the PRO for Wolf Trap this year reported that he will again get Wolf Trap started and run the event for the J/70s.

ONE DESIGN DIV. LT. CDR – All but one of the One Design after race social events have a host assigned. Plans are in progress for setting up a basic template that can be used to plan and execute each event as well as securing and quickly posting the race results following each series race.

ONE DESIGN DIV. RACE CHR – Making good progress in signing up chairs with only four event chairs outstanding – June 18th and the later three laser events.

CRUISING DIV. CDR – The cruisers have the following upcoming events:

OPTI DONATED TO DELTAVILLE MARITIME MUSEUM FOR FBYC EXHIBIT



This spring visitors to the Deltaville Maritime Museum will see some familiar history on display among the nautical history of the area. Club historian Jere Dennison and several other volunteers have been working with the Deltaville Maritime Museum to include an

exhibit on Fishing Bay Yacht Club that will include pictures, stories and other artifacts like an Opti and even one of old Club signs.

On March 11, an Opti donated by Luke and Logan Hayes was set up at the Deltaville Maritime Museum by Mark Hayes and Doug Bendura.
